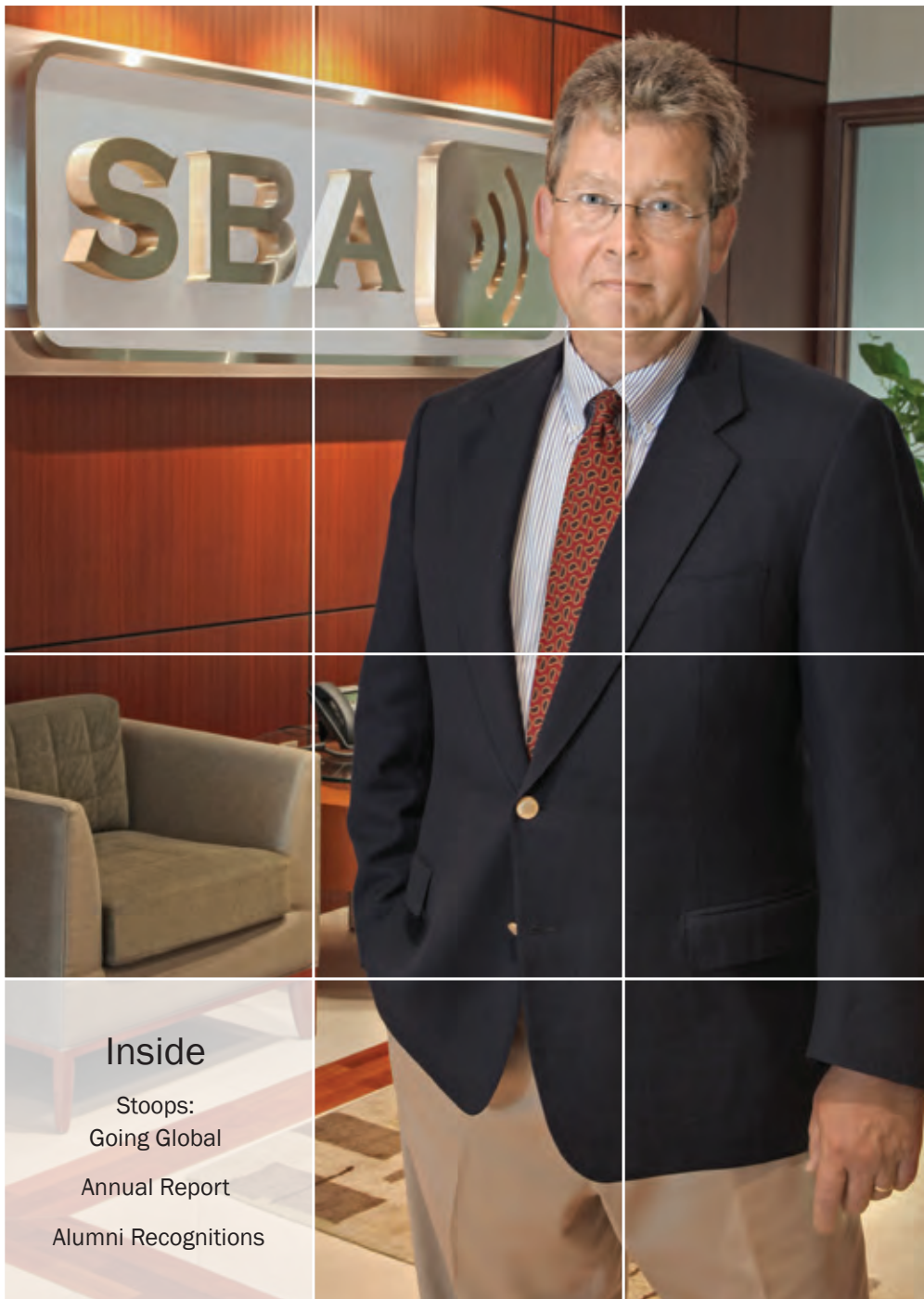

Remembering Dan Markel and Moving Forward with Our Students

This issue tells some of the story of our former colleague, Professor Dan Markel. Students, staff, faculty colleagues from near and far, and of course Dan's family, gathered in Tallahassee in September to express appreciation for how much Dan's work and life meant to all of us. It became clear to everyone that Dan

was a truly remarkable lawyer, scholar, teacher, colleague and person.

For many of us, our first few moves forward following Dan's death were difficult. His empty office symbolized the empty place in our school and in our hearts. What made moving forward possible was a return to the privileged work we at the law school have before us every day: helping our students.

The New Entering Class

This fall's new entering class brought with it a tide of new energy and enthusiasm that buoyed us all. There are several remarkable aspects to this new crop of 1Ls. First, there are more of them than last year. Although law school applications continued to decline last year, both nationally and at Florida State, we increased our entering 1Ls by approximately 10%, from last year's 170 to this year's 188. Second, despite the increase in size, we managed to maintain last year's strong academic credentials, including a median LSAT score of 159. Third, and perhaps most importantly, this class was more "diverse" than ever. An impressive 31 percent of our new 1L class was either Hispanic/Latino, African American or Asian American.

The great strength of our 1L class is the result of an "all hands on deck" effort, including a great admissions team, a wonderful Alumni Board Committee helping with recruitment, alumni who contributed scholarships, as well as alumni joining with faculty and staff to add the personal touch to the recruitment effort.

The increase in new 1Ls was more than offset by a decrease in transfer students. Last year, counting spring, summer and fall, we enrolled 94 transfer students. This year, we enrolled only 36 transfer students.

For many of us, our first few moves forward following Dan's death were difficult. His empty office symbolized the empty place in our school and in our hearts. What made moving forward possible was a return to the privileged work we at the law school have before us every day: helping our students.

Business Law Clinic Now Up-and-Running

This semester, we launched our new Business Law Clinic. It is headed by Professor Richard Benham ('05), former software entrepreneur and counsel to other entrepreneurs. Students enrolled in this clinic are earning academic credit as they help Richard provide advice to business startups all across the Florida State campus. In particular, the clinic is bringing us into closer working relationships with entrepreneurs in the business school.

Additional Recognition of Our Faculty

As I finalize this column, our faculty has just been rated the nation's 35th Top Law Faculty. The rating resulted from a survey of the readers of *Brian Leiter's Law School Reports*, the influential blog on legal education hosted by University of Chicago Law School Professor Brian Leiter. As with this spring's rating by *U.S. News & World Report*, we are again rated above all other Florida law schools. I know you all join me in congratulating our superbly talented and productive faculty.

Thank you again for all your support! We'll do our best to continue to make you proud.

Jeff Stoops ('84): Going Global

Since taking the helm as President and Chief Executive Officer of SBA Communications Corporation more than a decade ago, Jeff Stoops has steered the Boca Raton-based company to new heights. When Stoops left his partnership and varied corporate law practice at Gunster to join SBA, the company owned no cell towers but was looking to get into the business. Now, SBA owns and operates more than 22,000 cell phone towers across the United States and in Canada, Central America and South America, with more than 1,500 employees. In addition to growing the company's footprint, Stoops also has increased its worth. SBA currently is the sixth most valuable public company in Florida, with a value exceeding \$22 billion.

"We're the most valuable public company in Florida that no one has ever heard of," joked Stoops, a 1984 law graduate.

Stoops' relationship with SBA began by chance. SBA founder Steve Bernstein hired Gunster to help him evaluate a possible merger. "I got the phone call – and there were a number of corporate partners at SBA, so it could have gone to any one of us. It happened to come to me and I met Steve Bernstein. We began what has turned out to be a wonderful

relationship and partnership. I helped him figure out that what he was being offered wasn't a very good deal."

One of Stoops' first priorities during the early stages of his relationship with SBA was helping the company raise \$30 million for its initial private placement.

"I was brought in to begin our transition to tower ownership," said Stoops.

"My most important jobs today are setting strategy: deciding whether we are going to go into a new country, deciding whether we are going to go into a related line of business, deciding how much capital we allocate to our various business lines, helping my team do their jobs and also ensuring as best as I can that we have the best people in the best positions."

"Before I joined the company, the company didn't own any towers. I was brought in to transition the company to the company that it is today – primarily an asset-based company. When I joined we were exclusively a services company. There was no tower ownership industry, so I've had the fun and excitement to be at the start of and help shape an industry."

As a cell tower owner and operator, SBA can increase shareholder value two ways – by adding cell service tenants to

a tower or by adding towers.

"As we continued to grow in the United States, we saw a point in time where we would likely run out of enough opportunities to grow our tower portfolio exclusively in the U.S. to the magnitude we wanted," said Stoops. "We decided that we would expand our horizons and take the business outside

the United States. Operationally, the business of cell phone towers is pretty much the same around the world. We started in Canada in 2009 and then we went into Central America in 2010. At the end of 2012, we went into Brazil, which is already far and away our largest international market and one that we expect will be a big source of growth for years to come."

As SBA and Stoops have evolved together, Stoops' primary responsibility has become determining the company's

strategic direction.

“My most important jobs today are setting strategy: deciding whether we are going to go into a new country, deciding whether we are going to go into a related line of business, deciding how much capital we allocate to our various business lines, helping my team do their jobs and also ensuring as best as I can that we have the best people in the best positions. I try not to get too far into the details. I like to hire good people and let them do their jobs.”

Stoops believes his legal background

provided him with skills essential for his current role. “We’re heavily into finance and capital markets activities, so all my years as a corporate securities lawyer help me tremendously with new financings and in talking with investors. In addition, the tower business is very much a real estate business; it’s heavily contractual, with mortgages, zoning, ground leases, etc. – all very legally intensive aspects. With the combination of the real estate aspects of our business and the financing needs of our business, I feel particularly well-suited

to address those areas due to my legal background.”

Since Stoops became CEO in 2002, SBA’s stock has increased from about \$13.50 per share to more than \$112 per share. “As a public company CEO my job involves so many different things, but at the end of the day the one thing that matters most is stock price performance. Since I took over as CEO, our stock has appreciated on average annually over 17 percent over a 13 year period, which makes us one of the top performing public companies in the

country. We’re pretty proud of that.”

Stoops also takes pride in SBA’s reputation. “One of the things that SBA is very much known for is being a company of high integrity. We have a great reputation in our industry, and have no regulatory or legal issues to speak of. We work hard to be a responsible company and we are just as proud of that as we are our share price appreciation”.

In addition, Stoops stresses philanthropy at SBA. He encourages employees to be involved in the com-

Aggie, who holds a bachelor’s and a master’s degree in social work from Florida State University, has been by Stoops’ side for more than three decades. Although his job has always kept him busy, Stoops and

Stoops’ family has always been at the forefront of his personal and profes-sional decisions.

“When I finally made the decision to join SBA, I came home and told my wife I was leaving Gunster after 13 years, where I had started out as a first-year associate and worked my way up to partner. We’d just had twins so we had four young kids. In the initial shock of our decision, all Aggie could ask was, ‘Do they have health insurance?’ So thankfully they did and it’s all turned out okay,” joked Stoops.

“I consider myself a very lucky guy. I happened to take a risk on a business that was unproven at the time and it’s turned out very well. I think I’m an example of what good things can hap-pen when you step outside your comfort zone, take a risk and follow a dream. To get rewards in life, you have to take some risks.” ■

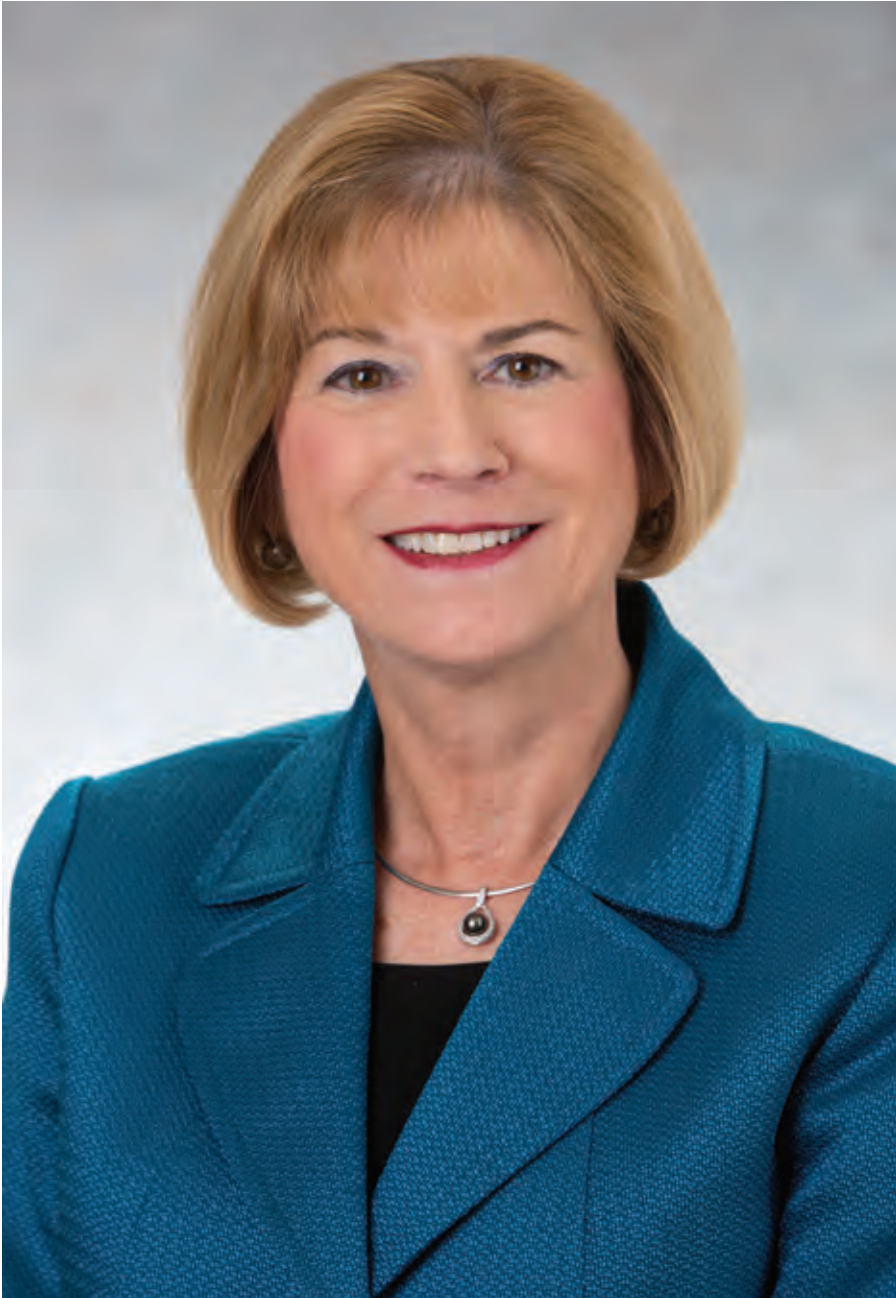
his wife still were able to enjoy traveling with their kids when they were growing up. The family has visited Africa for a safari, Europe, Alaska and Costa Rica, among other places.

Cecelia Bonifay ('84): From Planning to Practice

During her first career as a planner and a lobbyist, Cecelia Bonifay was surrounded by attorneys.

“I was the lobbyist for the Department of Community Affairs,” said Bonifay, who holds a master’s degree in planning from Florida State University. “As a planner, I was working on drafting legislation, but the other lobbyists were all primarily men and lawyers. They would always tell me, ‘That’s really nice that you helped draft this, but you need a lawyer to do these things.’ I was having to drag a lawyer around with me, so I said, ‘That can’t be that hard.’ I decided that if I were going to go to law school, I should go ahead and do it.”

Although she earned her law degree to further her lobbying career, her background in planning has translated into a very successful real estate and land use practice. After spending her first year out of law school as a plaintiff’s personal injury attorney in Orlando, Bonifay quickly realized that she wanted to make a switch.

“I was very active in Moot Court when I was at FSU and I thought I wanted to be a trial lawyer,” said Bonifay, who generously supports the law school’s Moot Court Team. “After about six months, I said, ‘I don’t think I want to do this anymore.’ That’s when I got in touch with people who had graduated ahead of me and said, ‘I’m really interested in being in the real estate, land use area and using my planning degree.’ One of them said, ‘I’m with

this great firm and they need somebody in Sarasota.’

“I have never regretted for a moment making that switch. This has been a wonderful career for me.”

The 1984 College of Law graduate practiced at several additional firms – including the Law Offices of Cecelia Bonifay – before being recruited by Akerman to lead its land use section in 1996. She primarily represents developers and land owners seeking approvals from the local, state or federal government to implement their development plans.

“I think it’s been a big help that I have the planning background and also that I was in the public sector for a number of years before going into the private sector. When I talk to local governments or elected officials, I really know what it is like to be in their position. It makes you more effective in doing your job and working through issues because most of what we do is trying to work through the local government process to get the client what they want.”

During her 18 years in Akerman’s Orlando office, Bonifay has witnessed many changes for her practice area and also substantial growth of the firm. Because she really enjoys the business side of the law practice, Bonifay has been on the Akerman board for several years, at a time that coincided with the recession. Although it was a difficult time for real estate in general, Akerman adopted a long-term view and focused on developing its talent.

“The recession was horrible, but that helped us hone in on what our core strengths were as a firm and also look for new areas of practice. That is when I really tried to expand land use into sus-

tainable development in terms of how we take advantage of new technology and how developers can include those concepts in their planning of a project. It’s still such an expanding area. We are going to continue to see new technology, better ways to do things, be more energy and water efficient, because we just can’t afford not to.”

As her firm’s national lateral integration partner and also a member of its six-person Executive Committee, Bonifay still helps shape her firm’s strategic direction. Bonifay is also involved in many local civic organizations and is immersed in the national community of land use professionals through the Urban Land Institute.

Bonifay is married to the Honorable Gregory Presnell, of the United States District Court for the Middle District of Florida. He practiced at Akerman for 33 years before taking the bench, but the couple met well before she joined the firm.

“He was at Akerman and said, ‘We’ll never practice together,’” recalled Bonifay. “I was always the spouse at firm retreats and events, so I knew everybody through Greg. When I went to Maguire, Voorhees and Wells, the Akerman attorneys were all horrified. They said, ‘We thought that if you ever quit what you were doing, you would come to us.’ My husband – he is so straight, that is why he is a good judge – said, ‘I don’t want to be in any way involved in that decision’ and stepped down as the office managing partner.”

When they aren’t at work, the couple can often be found fishing at their second home in Boca Grande. They also recently became involved in endurance

car racing.

“My husband took up sports car racing at a late age and he has a team called Level 1 Racing. They are in the ChumpCar series, which is intended for people who want to race but are not going to be at the highest levels of racing. So we have a 1994 Mazda Miata that they have stripped down and redone – it’s a very cool looking car.”

As a member of the team’s pit crew and the logistics person, Bonifay monitors time and keeps statistics during races. Typical races last about 14 hours, but the team’s next race at the end of December is 24 hours. Because that race will be much longer than usual, Bonifay recently was fitted for a fire suit so she can help with more than logistics.

“I was trying on helmets and looking at fire suits and I found my racing gloves because to help on the pit stop, you have to be fully suited.”

Bonifay has always committed herself fully to her clients, to her community and to her profession. The fact that she is so dedicated to her husband’s racing team should come as no surprise. ■

Marla Butler ('97): Focused on Firm and Family

As a law student, Marla Butler was sure she did not have the personality to be a firm lawyer. Butler – now the assistant managing partner and hiring partner in the New York City office of Robins, Kaplan, Miller & Ciresi – readily admits she was wrong. The 1997 College of Law grad turned out to be a perfect fit for the first and only law firm with which she interviewed.

“At the beginning of my 2L year, Florida State had the first of what I think is now known as the Atlanta interviewing program. I didn’t think I had the kind of personality that would allow me to comfortably fit into a law firm environment. I had this perception of law firms as being very stuffy. But this Atlanta program happened and I just went for it. And I only interviewed with Robins Kaplan. For probably half of the interview we were talking about things like my motorcycle and it was a very different kind of discussion than I ever anticipated having with a couple of partners at a big firm,” said Butler, who became a partner with the firm eight years after she joined as an associate.

Butler spent her first 13 years in the firm’s Atlanta office, building a strong IP and patent litigation practice. Being a “gadget person” with an extreme interest in technology makes Butler well suited for her practice areas.

“What I started learning in my first couple of years of practice was how to be a litigator – I litigated all types of cases,” said Butler, whose high-profile clients include GE and Xerox. “Then, there was one partner in the Atlanta office who was doing patent litigation and he asked me to do some research and I was immediately

hooked. What I learned was that, while I didn’t major in engineering or science, I have an aptitude for engineering concepts. That comes naturally to me.”

After that project, Butler persistently sought out additional patent litigation work and was able to fill her plate exclusively with cases in the area.

The Cleveland, Ohio native also spent her time in Atlanta climbing the firm’s leadership ranks. Butler always strives to make a difference in any organization of which she is a part. She has served on her firm’s diversity committee since its inception in 1999 and served as chair of the committee from 2008 until July of 2014.

“I also sat on the firm’s nine-member executive board from 2009 to 2012, which was an incredible experience. It’s where you see how the sausage is made and all the tough decisions that executive boards of firms make on many difficult issues.”

In 2010, her firm opened a New York office and Butler moved north to help build that office. Since then, she has added management and hiring roles to her plate. Her then-partner and now-wife, Lainie Butler, and the couple’s first child, who was 6 months old at the time, moved with Butler.

“I left Atlanta for many reasons, some of which are professional, but another part of it was we had decided we were not going to raise our son in a state where his parents’ marriage was not going to be legally recognized. We had started considering where else we might want to live and it coincided with the time that we were going to open up the New York office. When we moved in 2010 to the New York metro area,

one of the reasons we chose Connecticut (over New Jersey and New York) is because at that time it was the only of the three states where we could be legally married.”

In addition to their oldest son Jackson, who turned 5 in November, the Butlers have twins – Joshua and Juliana – who will celebrate their first birthday in March. Lainie stays home with the children.

“She is incredible,” said Butler about her wife. “I could not do what she does. I work a lot, I travel a lot and I could not do what I do with the firm, for my clients, without the incredible support that she gives me and our family. She keeps it all together.”

As a child, Butler’s parents provided her and her two older brothers with strong values. Her father’s pride in her, especially regarding her professional success, has driven Butler throughout her life.

On two occasions, Butler recalls giving her father her business cards, once in a Father’s Day card and once at a family gathering. “In 2002, my dad passed away unexpectedly. I remember very vividly going through his wallet. In his wallet, he just had a couple credit cards and a \$50 bill stashed in a place where he figured no one would find it. And he had a picture of my mom, a picture of me when I was about 5 years old, and those two business cards.”

Although her children are young, Butler already envisions them as adults: “In the long-term, my goal is to create a safe environment for our kids, where they grow up and feel like they can do whatever it is that is going to make them happy. To make them feel like there are no limits on what they can do while also making sure that they are kind, empathetic, caring people who understand how important it is to give back to the world.” ■

Judge Karen (Kinkennon) Specie ('78): Honored to Sit on the Federal Bench

Chief Bankruptcy Judge Karen Specie's specialization in bankruptcy law happened by chance. Upon graduating from law school, Judge Specie knew she wanted to broaden her horizons and move outside of Florida. She took a friend's suggestion to visit cities in which she might like to live and borrowed money from her parents to travel to Washington, D.C., the San Francisco area, New York City, Atlanta and Denver.

Judge Specie selected New York City,

packed her belongings, printed resumes and headed north. She researched firms specializing in commercial law at the NYU College of Law library and visited firms for three-and-a-half weeks before obtaining a job.

"The very first case the firm handed me to handle on my own was a bankruptcy case," recalled the 1978 College of Law graduate.

"Bankruptcy has been a fantastic career because you get to learn about and practice in cases involving virtu-

ally every type of business imaginable, and a huge variety of issues involving individuals as well; all under the umbrella of the federal bankruptcy code and bankruptcy rules. No matter where you go in the nation, the local and state laws can be different, but you're going to be practicing under the same set of rules and bankruptcy code that you are used to."

Judge Specie's career has included law practice at firms in Tampa, Gainesville and Jacksonville, practicing on her own and serving as a Chapter 7 bankruptcy trustee. Several years before becoming a judge she took a leave from practice to fight cancer. The nine-year breast cancer survivor's decision to pursue a judgeship was not made lightly. She debated about applying for a federal bankruptcy seat for approximately 15 years before she felt the time was right.

"I have represented just about any party you can name that ever becomes involved in bankruptcy cases and I felt that my career had prepared me for being able to do this job."

Judge Specie, who was appointed to the bench on her first attempt, submitted her application in June of 2011 and went through a "challenging" interview process before her appointment to the bench in July of 2012. "Bankruptcy judges are appointed for 14-year terms and we are selected by the circuit court of appeals for our region, so in this case the Eleventh Circuit Court of Appeals.

It is a very rigorous vetting of people from around the country with experience and resumes that make them eligible for the job. There are a total of approximately 350 bankruptcy judges nationwide, so it is very much a privilege and an honor to have been selected.”

Because many of the people in bankruptcy proceedings are under extreme stress, Judge Specie strives to be compassionate.

“I try to treat everyone with respect and dignity. Even though bankruptcy judges are faced with making some really difficult rulings, at least if I take the time to explain my ruling, especially when I’m dealing with someone who is not represented by an attorney, at least they know that someone is listening to them and is respecting them as a human being. And sometimes that is the most I can do.”

As the only bankruptcy judge for the Northern District of Florida, Judge Specie presides over hearings in all four of the district’s divisions. She is based in Tallahassee, but travels to the Pensacola, Panama City and Gainesville courthouses frequently. With more than 4,000 pending cases in the district, Judge Specie must run an efficient court. She typically presides over 20-50 cases per hearing day. Because she also serves as the district’s chief bankruptcy judge, Judge Specie is responsible for all of the court’s administrative decisions.

“One of my primary goals is to be a good leader. I see my role to help formulate a vision for our future, and then to do as much as possible to implement that vision,” said Judge Specie, who is a Fellow in the American College of Bankruptcy and has held various Flor-

ida Bar leadership positions throughout her career. “I could not do my job, or be successful, without the wonderful staff I have, not only in chambers but in the clerk’s office. Our court staff is very capable and hard working. Our clerk’s office staff go the extra mile to serve the public; especially the lawyers and pro se litigants who come to our court.”

Judge Specie also acknowledges that her success would not have been possible without support from her family. “My husband and I have worked as a true team for many, many years, sharing child care, grocery shopping, cooking, homework, PTA and other school related activities, budgeting, and all other household duties. My husband and three children have been incredibly patient over the years with my taking business calls at all hours and on vacation, staying home to try a case while they went on vacation without me, answering e-mails and going to meetings while they might prefer me being more engaged. They are very proud of me, and I of them. I am grateful for their unselfish support over the many years of my professional career.”

The Specie are thankful that their three adult children are doing very well. “Our eldest son graduated college four years ago and is working in a career he loves; he recently married his soulmate and they are happily building a life together,” said Judge Specie. “Our youngest son has excelled in a rigorous Doctor of Physical Therapy program and is looking forward to a career in that field. Our daughter is a college junior making superior grades while staying active with her sorority and volunteering with various philanthropic

organizations.”

Judge Specie’s husband of 33 years, Gary, is a CCIM real estate broker who owns his own business in Gainesville, where the couple met as undergraduates at the University of Florida. Although relocation to Tallahassee may be in their future, the outdoor-loving pair still resides near Gainesville with their two dogs and two horses. Judge Specie cannot remember a time when she did not love horses. She even mucked out stalls when she was a law student to pay for weekly riding lessons.

Judge Specie attributes her successes in her career, and in life in general, to her faith, which she says is central to her and her husband’s lives. “I pray daily for wisdom, patience and insight, especially each time I am about to take the bench or make a difficult ruling.”

Now that she commutes to Tallahassee for work, Judge Specie no longer serves as an adjunct professor at the UF law school – a cherished position she held for 4 years. Her primary focus now is her seat on the bench, although she would love to teach again in future.

“I want to be the best bankruptcy judge I can possibly be,” said Judge Specie. “Even though I practiced law for about thirty years before taking the bench, I’m still constantly learning: from other judges, from litigants and from lawyers in the courtroom.” ■

Remembering Dan Markel

Following a brief welcome from Dean Don Weidner, several individuals spoke about Markel:

- Wayne A. Logan, Gary & Sallyn Pajcic Professor,
- Michael Cahill, vice dean and professor of law at Brooklyn Law School,
- Fernando Tesón, Tobias Simon Eminent Scholar,
- Franita Tolson, Betty T. Ferguson Professor of Voting Rights,
- Mary Rachel Barnhill, Esq., former student from Norton, Virginia,
- Alejandra Berlioz, third-year student,
- Mark Spottswood, assistant professor, and
- Shelly Markel, Professor Markel's sister.

Described by Logan as a “publishing dynamo” who was admitted to full professor two years early, Markel was a respected scholar in the area of criminal law. Logan, who also publishes and teaches in the criminal law area, remarked, “He was what might be called a new retributivist, so he critically re-examined retributive theory in criminal law and he was really at the forefront of that and he achieved a national and international reputation in that regard.”

Logan continued, “Dan was firmly ensconced in the legal academy and really distinguished himself in traditional law reviews in the publishing world. He also was a public intellectual. Dan published in *The New York Times*, *The Atlantic* magazine, *The New Republic* magazine, and *Slate*. It's rare these

days for law professors to have such a broad reach in terms of their intellectual grasp and Dan really did that.”

In addition, Markel's colleagues praised him for bringing the Florida State faculty together and for connecting members of the national legal academy, especially young professors.

“He really was the Kevin Bacon of the legal academy. Like, literally, six degrees of separation between Danny and everybody else,” said Tolson. “We also know that at least half of the legal community, or probably more, had the privilege of calling him either mentor, or calling him friend, or calling him both or some variation thereof.”

“I have never met anyone, ever, with such a strong talent to build communities – communities of a special kind, not just any community, communities of thought, of ideas, friendships with a purpose,” said Tesón.

Cahill spoke about a colloquium on which he had collaborated with Markel for several years. “I say that we co-organized

it, but Dan did all the work. He did everything and I was there only for the sake of giving the New York City Criminal Theory Colloquium some connection to New York City.

“It was my hope that we’d be able to bring together people from all of the schools in New York, maybe if we were lucky people from New Jersey would show up. Dan’s ambitions were not so modest. The mailing list for our colloquium over time grew to include pretty much everyone around the world who cares about criminal law theory. He actually had the sheer force of will to get people not only to receive our mailings but to actually to come. So instead of just coming from across the

Hudson River, we would get participants from Philadelphia and Illinois and California and Canada and Great Britain and Israel and everywhere else that Dan knew people, which is to say, everywhere.”

Tolson also spoke about Markel’s impact on the College of Law community. “Since I have been a member of the faculty here, I have felt very lucky to be a part of such an inclusive community and Danny was a big part of that. The year I arrived at FSU was the year that Danny went up for tenure, so that gives you some sense of how busy he was. Despite being busy, he would invite me to lunch, he would invite me to his home to spend time with him and his family, he consistently asked about my well-being and that of my family. And all of this was on top of the things that he did for me career-wise.”

Markel’s former students spoke through tears about the impact Markel had on their lives.

“After your passing, I read every news article about you. I became so eager to soak up all of your wisdom. I reread our emails. I read the letter of recommendation you wrote me when I was applying for federal clerkships, and it became so clear how much of an impact you had in my life.” said Berlioz, who was Markel’s research assistant. “You assisted me in so many ways during the period that I worked with you. You went above and beyond in helping my development. You were truly a great professor.”

Speakers also peppered their remarks with heartwarming stories about their friendships with Markel.

“He was a very unusual law professor,” said Spottswood. “Faculty, in general, can have a tendency to sort of compartmentalize their lives. Danny just wanted to tear all of those

walls down, and the way he did it was just to exemplify it in his own life. I don't have many colleagues I've ever had who would say, 'Come over to my house and have dinner with my kids and then we'll read them stories together.' It was a very different kind of friendship that Danny modeled and encouraged the rest of us to live."

Speakers also remarked on Markel's deep devotion to his children. His sister stated that her brother was "a serious guy, an academic, a professor, and yet he always knew his priority was his boys and he wasn't afraid to let the entire world know it."

"If his eyes lit like candles for academic passions, I can only describe the light that shone in Markel the father's eyes as grand beacons of unparalleled brightness. He would often have his first son visit the smaller, more intimate classes. Even before his son would arrive, we would know a visit was forthcoming just by the love and excitement in Dan's eyes

and the extra bounce in his step," Barnhill recalled. "Despite all Markel's extraordinary work and other interests, his sons were undoubtedly what Markel considered his greatest achievements."

Tesón tearfully concluded his remarks: "Dear Danny, I miss you and cannot stop grieving for you. I will never forget your brief but shining presence in my life. You'll always be with me."

The memorial concluded with an award presentation by Dean Weidner to Markel's parents. Weidner presented Phil and Ruth Markel with the law school's Alumni Class of '66 Award for Markel. The award recognizes a non-Florida State University College of Law graduate who has rendered distinguished service to the law school and to the community. Recipients are inducted into the entering Class of 1966 to commemorate the year that the College of Law opened its doors. Immediately following the memorial, a reception was held in the Rotunda. ■

Q&A with 2L Chancey Smith

Why did you decide to attend Florida State University College of Law?

I was very intrigued by FSU's international programs and the range of expertise that the school had to offer. I applied to law school from overseas, and was very impressed by how friendly and helpful the admissions office was throughout the entire process.

Why are you interested in international law?

I saw international law as a way to incorporate my passion for traveling into a career. I love being immersed in a new culture and getting to know where other people come from.

Tell us about your externship at the Constitutional Court of Korea – Seoul during the summer of 2014.

Working at the court was an incredible opportunity to experience many different kinds of legal work while observing and learning how to navigate Korean professional culture. The Korean attitude toward work is very different from what we think of in America. It is very much about "saving face." The culture is very hierarchical. Even the language changes depending on the status of the person you are talking to. As a result, communication is often inefficient because it is impolite to offer improvements on a supervisor's idea. Throughout my experience Professor Gertz provided a lot of helpful prompts to facilitate thought about the differences in the legal systems as well.

While at the court I wrote research memos comparing several areas of Korean and American law. Much of my research focused on comparative abortion law. I also observed hearings at the Constitutional Court and worked closely with my supervisor and helped her select and research the topic for her upcoming paper regarding the rights of asylum seekers in South Korea. In addition to my work, I reached out to several fascinating international lawyers in Seoul and was truly inspired by their work and attitude toward their profession.

You had worked in South Korea before law school. What did you do previously and how did that impact your externship?

I taught Kindergarten at a private English Academy in Seoul before coming to law school. I fell in love with Korean culture and lifestyle. I love the energy of Seoul. It is extremely crowded and fast-paced, but everyone is very friendly and you get a real sense of connection. I love being around people and meeting new faces all of the time, and Seoul is incredibly social. Many Korean people do not socialize in their homes so restaurants and bars are always full of life. There is a thriving expat community within the very homogeneous Korean culture that makes it very easy to become involved, and Korean people are extremely welcoming and eager to help. Seoul is also very safe and easy to navigate. I felt comfortable by myself in the city at any hour of the day or night, and unlike many major cities in the U.S. there are not any neighborhoods to avoid. I cultivated several meaningful friendships in Seoul and knew I wanted to come back to the city. I actually learned about my externship this summer through a very good friend that I met while I was teaching.

What were your favorite assignments during the externship?

I really liked working closely with my mentor and helping her with research for her long-term projects. Typically, the research officers produce two major research papers per year, and I got to help my mentor research and pick her next topic which addresses the rights of asylum seekers in Korea. I am really excited to read her paper when it is published.

What did you do in your free time in South Korea?

I cherished the time I had with friends there, and I spent a lot of time outside. The Han Park runs along the river all the way through the city. It is a great place to picnic or ride bikes. I also did a lot of hiking while I was there. You wouldn't think of a major city being a good place to hike, but there are several beautiful hikes in the city limits. It is really the best of both worlds for me because there is the excitement and the social aspect of the city with the outdoors so easily accessible.

What advice would you give to students who want to pursue an international externship?

Go out and find what you want and keep looking for ways to get there. My fellow externs at the court were all Ivy League students. One day I asked my supervisor why she hired me and she told me it was because I applied for the position more than a year in advance so she knew I genuinely wanted the experience.

What advice would you give to students and alums who want to visit or work in South Korea?

During 1L orientation, Dean Weidner advised our class to “be interested” and it is something that I have truly taken to heart. If you make an effort to be genuinely interested and open to new experiences and opportunities then your experiences are much more rewarding on a professional and personal level. No matter where you are visiting or looking for employment it is important to stay interested both in the people that you meet and in the work that you are doing.

What do you want to do professionally after graduating from Florida State Law?

I am currently interning with Air Force JAG, and am loving the experience. I am not positive as to what I will do after graduation. However, I would be excited and honored for the opportunity to become a member of the Air Force JAG Corps. Ultimately, I want to find a job that I am excited for, and I think that could take many forms for me. There are so many different opportunities to pursue in the law, and FSU has created an invaluable network of staff and alumni to help guide the way.

How has completing the externship in South Korea benefited you as a student and future lawyer?

The practice of navigating professional cultural and language barriers will be helpful for any international career, and it was a great feeling to be able to help with such high profile research. It has also helped me to realize that I am very happy with my decision to come to Florida State Law. It was a great comfort to be able to have such a challenging experience with the guidance of so many people at FSU. ■

Although returning to the classroom after many years away has been difficult, Savage has particularly enjoyed studying with law students. “It has been a challenge, and has forced me to rebuild some of my skills in reading and critically analyzing new content. My current professor is a graduate of Harvard Law School and

one of the most intelligent and well-spoken teachers I have ever experienced. I would have never had the opportunity to learn and grow in this way, if I had not enrolled in the JM program.”

Arrant recommends that others enroll in the future: “I would encourage anyone who is curious about the law to enroll for the simple fact that you

can learn about whatever interests you without the pressures of full-on law school. You don’t have to quit your job. You don’t have to take classes that you don’t find the subject matter valuable. You don’t have to commit three years of your life to it. You don’t have to sit for the bar exam. It truly is just an opportunity to learn and make yourself a more marketable and valuable employee to any potential employer. Plus you walk away with a master’s degree in something that very few other people have.”

Sam Wiseman Named McConnaughay and Rissman Professor

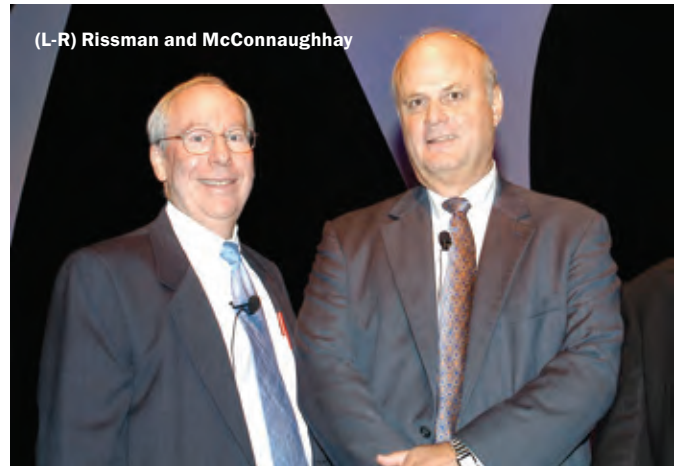

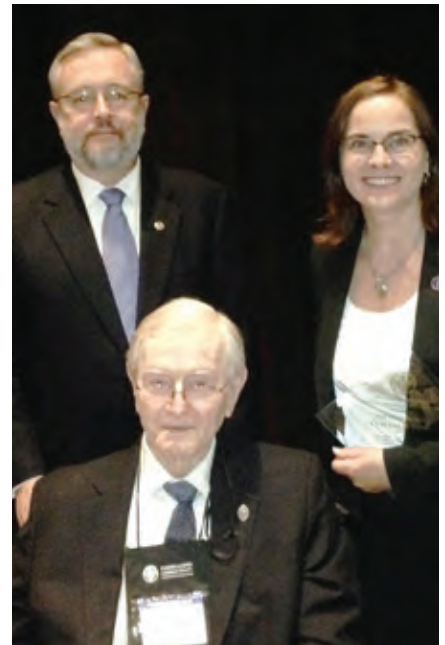

Dean's Annual Fundraising Report



This was a year of great success for the law school. We are now rated as the #1 law school in Florida by *U.S. News & World Report*. Part of the reason for this ranking is our extraordinary job placement rate.

Private fundraising makes a critical difference at the law school, helping us to attract and to support the best students and faculty.

TOTAL GIFTS AND PLEDGES

Putting annual giving and larger gifts together, we raised a cash total of \$1,246,644 and new pledges in the amount of \$561,015, for a grand total of \$1,807,659.

ANNUAL GIVING FROM ALUMNI

An all-time high of 30.9% of our alumni made cash gifts to the law school! Based on the latest American Bar Association data, this level of participation should keep us within the nation's top 10 law schools in terms of alumni giving rate. This level of alumni contributions provides critical support and sends a powerful signal about the enthusiasm our alumni have for the school.

ANNUAL GIVING FROM STUDENTS

This past year, 84.23% of our students contributed to our Annual Fund. Our student enthusiasm and generosity bodes well for the future. They are blazing the trail for us all!

LARGER GIFTS

This past year, we received cash payments on Larger Gifts totaling \$685,344 and new pledges on Larger Gifts in the amount of \$516,015, for a grand total of \$1,201,359. The "Cash Gifts By Level" portion of this report includes only cash payments made during the fiscal year, even if they were but a portion of a larger gift. Under the heading of "Recent Larger Gifts," we outline the larger gift commitments that we received in the 2013-2014 fiscal year.

Endowed Gift Opportunities

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

Our single greatest need from private giving is endowed scholarships. To continue to serve our mission of providing access to all, including those from families of modest means, we need significantly more scholarships. Scholarships are awarded according to the intent of the donor and may be based on merit, need, or other factors.

The minimum gift needed to endow a scholarship is \$25,000. This \$25,000 can be paid \$5,000 per year for five years.

ENDOWED PROFESSORSHIPS AND CHAIRS

Our faculty members are being recruited by some of the nation's most prominent law schools. In recent years, we have lost faculty to the University of Illinois (two), the University of Virginia (two), Vanderbilt University (two), the University of Pennsylvania, and the University of Utah. Endowed professorships and chairs give us the merit money we need to retain our top faculty.

Endowed professorships and chairs provide salary supplements based on merit. Faculty members are appointed for five-year terms, with renewal contingent on continued scholarly productivity. The appointee bears the name of the donor or the donor's designee.

The minimum gift needed to endow a professorship at Florida State University College of Law is \$200,000. The minimum gift needed to endow a chair at Florida State Law is \$1,000,000. These gifts can be paid over a five-year period.

ENDOWMENTS FOR EXCELLENCE

Endowments for Excellence are used, at the discretion of the law school, for purposes such as student scholarships, faculty incentives, general discretionary dollars and funding for co-curricular activities such as *Law Review*, Mock Trial, and Moot Court.

The minimum gift needed to create an Endowment for Excellence is \$25,000. This \$25,000 can be paid \$5,000 per year for five years.

ENDOWMENTS FOR PARTICULAR PROGRAMS

An important goal of the law school is to raise substantial endowments to support special programs and co-curricular organizations.

Private philanthropy has helped us take existing programs to new levels of excellence. Our award-winning Moot Court and Mock Trial Teams cannot travel to competitions without private contributions. Our Public Interest Law Center, which includes the Children's Advocacy Clinic, the Family Law Clinic, and the Medical-Legal Partnership, relies on private contributions to help pay to train students to provide effective legal services to the under-represented.

Some programs, for example, our Summer for Undergraduates Program, simply would not exist at the law school but for the generous support of our alumni.

The minimum gift needed to create an endowment for a particular program is \$25,000. This \$25,000 can be paid \$5,000 per year for five years.

DONOR RECOGNITION

We are delighted to recognize scholarships, professorships and other targeted gifts by naming them in honor of the donor or the donor's designee. In addition, we are pleased to acknowledge inter vivos gifts of \$200,000 or more with an oil portrait of the donor or the donor's designee that will be displayed in a prominent place at the law school.

The Advocacy Center and the renovated spaces in Roberts Hall give us many new spaces to name to thank donors for gifts starting at \$25,000.

Recent Larger Gift Commitments

We would like to specially thank those of you who made a larger gift commitment between July 1, 2013 and June 30, 2014. These gifts make it possible to continue the dynamic advancement of the academic programs and reputation of the law school.

\$100,000 TO \$999,999

Lawrence A. (Larry) Kellogg ('81) has created a **\$200,000** endowment for the **Kellogg Family Professorship**. The income from the endowment will provide a salary supplement to help attract or retain an outstanding legal scholar. Larry previously gave \$133,000 to endow the Kellogg Family Scholarship, which is awarded to students who worked their way through college or who are supporting children while attending law school. In recognition of the new gift, the law school has named a classroom in Roberts Hall the **Kellogg Family Classroom**. Larry's son Jason is a 2002 graduate of the law school and Jason's wife Cassandra is a 2004 graduate. Cassandra practices at Gautier & Hasty, P.L. in Coral Gables.

Margaret A. (Peggy) Rolando ('78) has agreed to supplement the existing **Peggy Rolando Endowment for Excellence** with an additional **\$100,000** gift. This new pledge will bring the endowment to \$200,000. The income generated from the endowment may be used for student scholarships or a professorship. In the event that the income is used for a professorship it shall be awarded only to recruit or retain a professor teaching and/or publishing in the area of real estate law, including such subspecialties as oil and gas, basic property law,

condominium law, real estate finance, and commercial leasing. In recognition of the new gift, the law school has named a seminar room in Roberts Hall the **Peggy Rolando Seminar Room**. Professor Karen Oehme of the College of Social Work and **Professor Nat Stern** of the College of Law have made a pledge of **\$50,000** to create the **Abraham and Rhea Stern Endowment**. This gift will equally fund both the **Abraham Stern Moot Court Scholarship** and the **Abraham and Rhea Stern Scholarship**. The recipient of the Abraham Stern Moot Court Scholarship shall be the *Nat Stern Award* honoree. That award is given to a member of the Moot Court Team who is a second-year law student for outstanding service and dedication to the team. 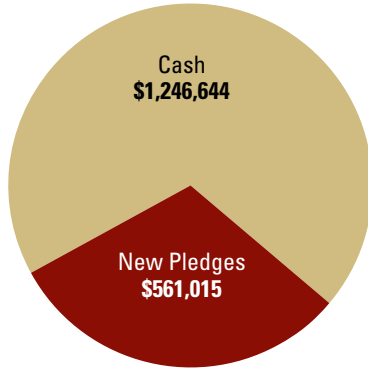

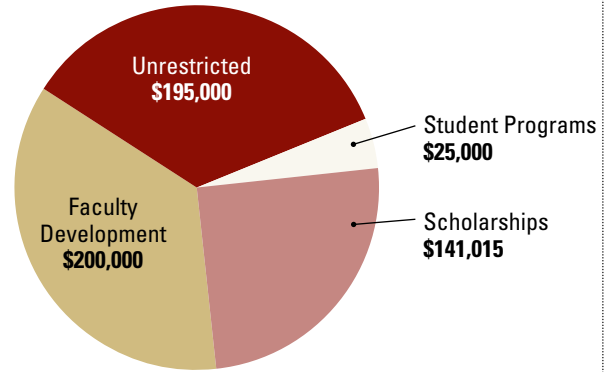

2013-2014 Total Cash and New Pledges Received: \$1,807,659*

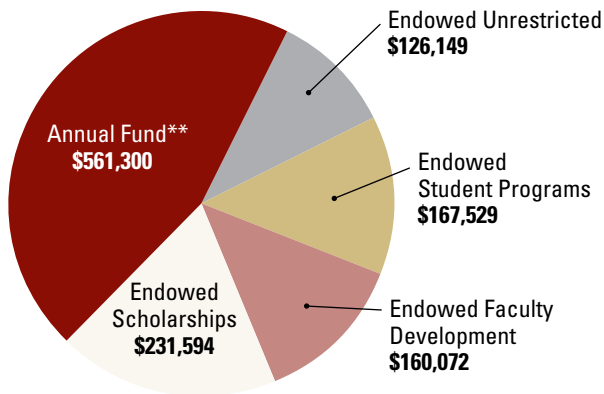

2013-2014 New Pledges by Purpose: \$561,015



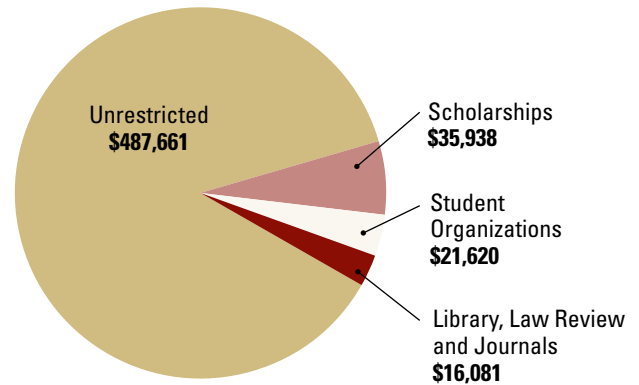
2013-2014 Cash Received by Purpose: \$1,246,644*

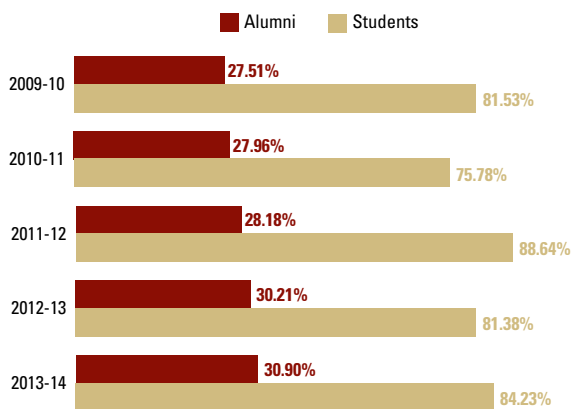

2013-2014 Annual Fund Cash Received by Purpose: \$561,300*

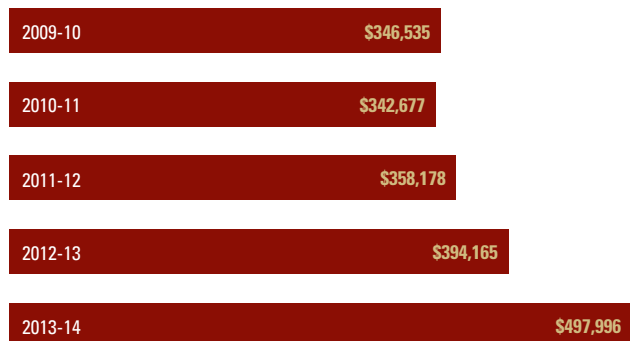

Alumni and Students Cash Giving Rates

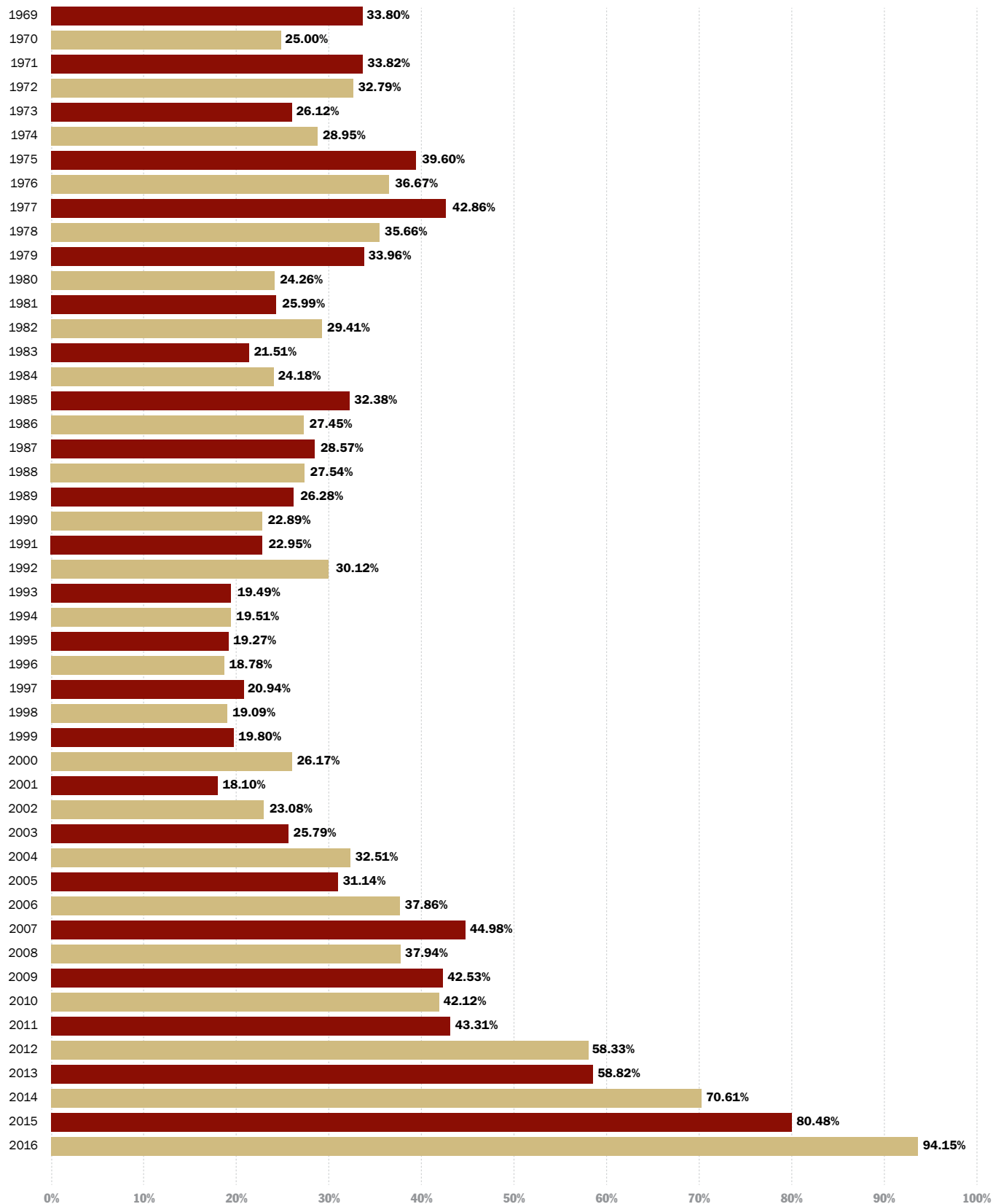


Total Alumni Cash Gifts to the Annual Fund*

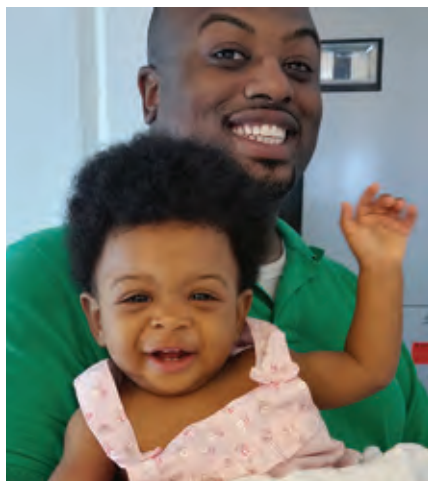

The honor was announced Saturday, October 18, at the Animal Legal Defense Fund’s annual Animal Law Conference in Portland, Oregon. Florida State law students and SALDF members Sara McNeill and Sarah Bailey accepted the award at the event.

Florida State’s SALDF was honored following a year of many accomplishments. During 2014, SALDF spoke to officials with the Florida Legislature and with the City of Tallahassee to advocate for animals, hosted lectures by animal law experts, and sponsored an animal law writing competition open to students from all Florida law schools. This November, SALDF also co-hosted at the College of Law the Southeastern Animal Law Symposium, the first animal law conference in Florida.

Florida State Ranked Nation’s #2 Law School for Hispanic Students

In August, *HispanicBusiness* named Florida State University College of Law the nation’s #2 law school for Hispanic students. This is the 11th year in a row that *HispanicBusiness* has rated FSU in the top 10 and represents the school’s highest rating to date.

HispanicBusiness based its rankings on Hispanic student enrollment, Hispanic faculty members, Hispanic student retention rates, special programs aimed at increasing enrollment of and at supporting Hispanic students, and school reputation as reflected in *U.S. News & World Report*.

“We are all thrilled to once again be named in the *HispanicBusiness* top 10,” said Dean Donald J. Weidner. “Our community as a whole is enriched by the Hispanic and Latino dimensions of our students, faculty, staff and alumni.”

Florida State Ranked Nation's 10th Best Value Law School

The National Jurist magazine has ranked Florida State University College of Law the 10th best value law school in the nation. The ranking, which was published in *The National Jurist's* September/October 2014 issue, weighs important student outcomes – bar passage rate and employment rate – against tuition, cost of living and indebtedness. According to *The National Jurist*, the rankings are “designed to find the law schools where graduates have excellent chances of passing the bar and getting a legal job without taking on a ton of debt.” Florida State is the only law school in Florida ranked in the top 10. This is the sixth year in a row that *The National Jurist* has ranked Florida State one of the nation's top 15 best value law schools.

The national ranking reflects the law school's strong student outcomes. Florida State graduates passed the most recent administration of the Florida Bar Examination at a rate of 81.8%. By contrast, the overall passing rate for first-time test takers was 71.8%. Additionally, a *National Law Journal* report (2014) rates Florida State as Florida's #1 law school, and the nation's 25th best, in terms of the percentage of 2013 graduates employed nine months after graduation in full-time, long-term, bar passage-required jobs not funded by the school.

“We are thrilled to be ranked once again as #1 in Florida, especially because employment rate is the highest weighted factor in this ranking,” said Dean Don Weidner. “Launching the careers of our students is the most important thing we do.”

Record 30.68 Percent of Alumni Contribute to the College of Law

Thank you to the record 30.68 percent of Florida State University College of Law alumni who made cash contributions to the law school during the 2013-14 fiscal year! This rate exceeds previous results that placed Florida State among the nation's top 10 law schools in terms of alumni contribution rate, according to the most recently published American Bar Association data. Those data also showed that Florida State's giving rate was more than triple the giving rate of any other Florida law school.
