## 2026 Miami Blockchain Symposium

The **Stoops Center for Law and Business** and the **Institute of Law, Technology, & Innovation**, in partnership with the **Rutgers Center for Corporate Law and Governance Blockchain and FinTech Program** and **Sidley Austin LLP**, recently hosted the **2026 Miami Blockchain Symposium**.

The full-day program brought together innovators, policymakers, financial industry leaders, and academic experts from Sidley Austin's Miami office to examine the legal, regulatory, and market forces shaping digital asset and blockchain innovation. The symposium featured a full schedule of panels, discussions, and presentations exploring regulatory developments, emerging technologies, and evolving business models in the digital asset space.

Last Thursday, **Survive and Thrive Advocacy Center (STAC)** hosted a **Human Trafficking Symposium at the College of Law**, bringing together community leaders and survivors for candid discussions on the harms of exploitation and strategies for prevention.

This powerful symposium brought together sex and labor trafficking survivors, legal experts, law enforcement, advocates, and community leaders for an in-depth exploration of how systems can, and must, respond to human trafficking.



That same day, **Professor Paolo Annino**, Glass Professor of Public Interest Law and Director of the Public Interest Law Center and the Children's Advocacy Clinic, presented at an event titled **Advocacy in Action: Strategic Legal Tools for Human Trafficking Cases Involving Children**, with the help of two 2L students, Emma Smith and Valerie Busto, both members of **Human Trafficking and Exploitation Law Project (HELP)**.

Wrapping up the day, at the STAC awards ceremony, Professor Annino received the **2026 Imagine Freedom Gratitude Award** in recognition of his leadership and dedication to the HELP program, which allows law students to represent children who have survived sex and labor trafficking, provides community presentations and outreach on human trafficking, and advocates for legislation to prevent trafficking in Florida and the United States.

We are proud of Professor Annino and our students' continued efforts to combat human trafficking.

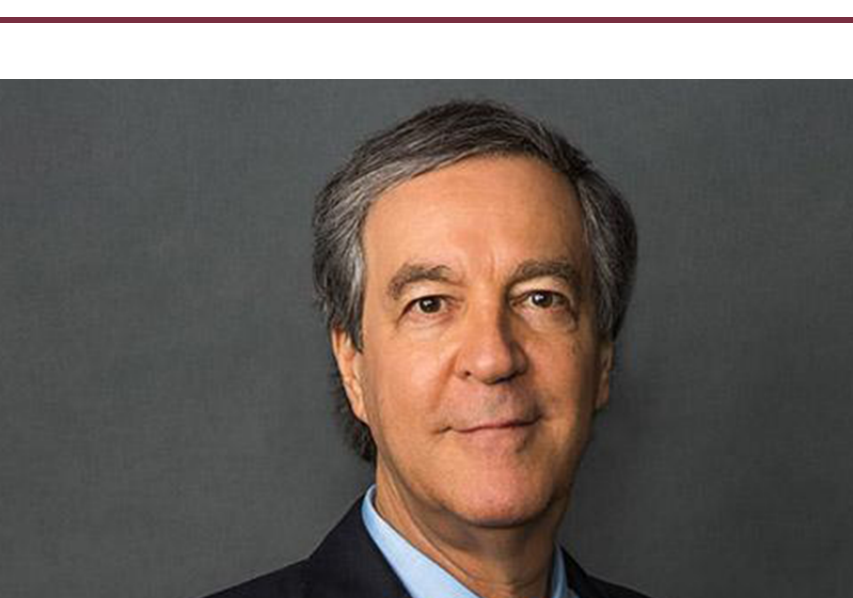

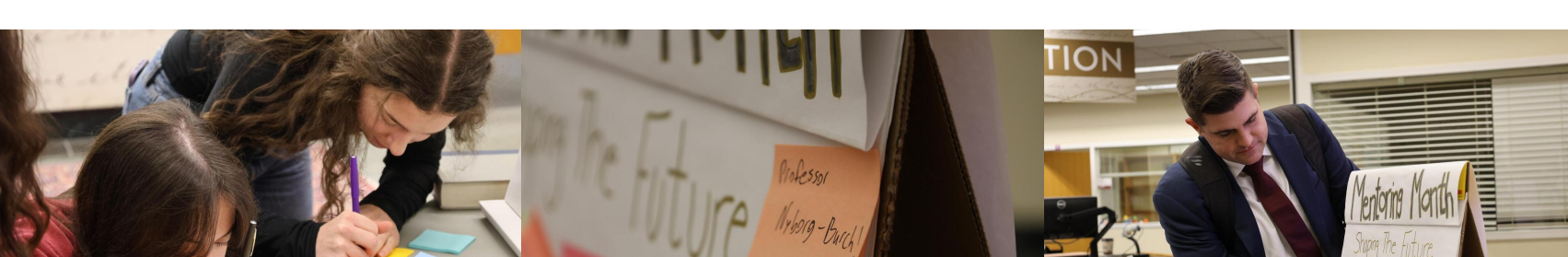
## FSU Law Social Spotlight
