

Additionally, at a rate of 94.48%, we are among the nation's top law schools in terms of class of 2016 graduates who passed a bar examination in any jurisdiction within two years of graduating. The hard work and dedication of our alumni is evident in these impressive results! We also believe the increased bar support services spearheaded by our Academic Programs and Student Advancement Offices are paying dividends, so we continue to look for


