

helping students evaluate and select schools recognizes we are extremely



He also captures individual biometric data using optical character recognition software, and he previously assisted in integrating a paperless data capture system, providing input on the design and execution of a traveling tablet system. In addition, he has worked with clients by giving technical presentations in pitch meetings, providing a tutorial of all Health Designs services and capabilities, and he has developed client-specific, custom reporting packages. Jreij worked with Health Designs as a junior data analyst the year before beginning law school. During the summer before his 2L year, Jreij was a legal intern with the Seminole County Board of County Commissioners. There, he researched and prepared office memoranda regarding topics including purchasing contracts, property disputes, eminent domain, and local government policy. He also drafted local county executive orders regarding COVID-19, provided summary memoranda for newly proposed bills, and attended local government meetings to

provide summary memoranda on the discussions. At FSU Law, Jreij is involved with the Intellectual Property Law Society and the Student Bar Association. He took the patent bar during winter break.
