

At the end of July, we celebrated summer 2022 graduates with a special



Law students are finishing summer externships in cities around the country and in London. Nearly 100 students have externed at a wide variety of placements, including state attorney and public defender offices, nonprofits, state and federal government agencies, law firms, corporate in-house counsel departments, and state and federal courts. Twenty-four of the students participated in our 1L Judicial Externship Program and worked directly with judges in Florida, Alabama, and New York. The experience FSU Law students acquired during their externships will benefit them throughout the rest of their studies and after they graduate, and FSU Law is grateful to the alumni and other attorneys and judges who supervised externs this summer.
